IMPORTANT NOTICE

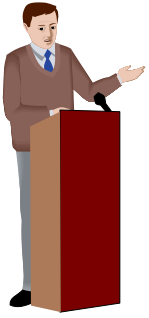

Cookbooks are looked at in respect of foreign influences in our cooking, and sharing of cookery knowledge between generations, changing technology in methods and recipes.

Postcards from Tukums

A Family Detective Story by Ann Gluckman

The uncovering of a box of letters when an old family home was being demolished helped piece together a family history which had been largely concealed. Tukums is in Latvia, the part of Imperial Russia, and the family had left there to settle in Stratford, New Zealand. These letters, along with a set of postcards, were used to search the reasons for this family coming to New Zealand.

This book follows the experiences and occupations of Mabel Pollock from her nursing career in 1943 through to her departure for her OE in 1974. Mabel (known as Polly) was born on Cape Saunders Lighthouse Station and she spent her early life in Auckland.

Irish Ship Passenger Lists

The Irish Family History Foundation's Online Research Service (ORS) is pleased to announce the availability of a new source of records. The **Centre for Migration Studies**, Omagh, Co. Tyrone, has provided over **227,000** names of **Ship Passengers**.

The records are of passengers, mostly of Irish origin, on ships travelling from **Irish and British** ports to ports in **North America** (United States and Canada) from **1791 to 1897**.
